#### Overview

The data presented in this report provide an overview of English placement, enrollment, throughput, and course success for new-to-college students at Cosumnes River College (CRC) over the last five fall terms. *New-to-college* students are defined as students who were flagged as "New" in the Los Rios PeopleSoft Database who had no experience in the district prior to summer (aside from dual enrollment). This executive summary provides a high level overview of trends for new-to-college students, as well as an overview of trends in equity gaps. For a particular metric (e.g., transfer-level placement rates), an *equity gap* is defined as the percentage point difference between the overall cohort rate and the rate for a specific demographic group (e.g., Foster Youth, Female, etc.). Additional definitions and data can be found later in the document. Note that not all data are described in this executive summary.

#### **Placement**

- 1. Transfer-level placement remained mostly stable in Fall 2020 with a very slight increase from 87.5% in Fall 2019 to 88.5% in Fall 2020 (*Table 1*).
- 2. Equity gaps in transfer-level placement increased for Foster Youth and Veteran students, and equity gaps were reduced for First Generation and Native American students (*Table 1*).
- 3. Although the gap in transfer-level placement for African American students was nearly zero in Fall 2019, it increased to -4.8% in fall 2020 (*Table 1*).

#### **Enrollment**

- 1. In Fall 2020, transfer-level enrollment remained mostly stable for new-to-college students with an increase from 46.2% in Fall 2019 to 47.1% (*Table 2*).
- 2. Equity gaps in transfer-level enrollment shrank for African American, Native American, Male, Foster Youth, Veteran, and First Generation Students (*Table 2*).
- 3. An equity gap in transfer-level enrollment emerged for White students in Fall 2020.
- 4. The percentage of new-to-college students in ENGWR 300 increased by 4.9% in Fall 2020 (*Table 8*).

### **Throughput**

- 1. First term throughput in transfer-level English for new-to-college students declined from 33.2% in Fall 2019 to 31.3% in Fall 2020 (*Table 3*).
- 2. Equity gaps in throughput in transfer-level English increased for Native American and First Generation students. Gaps remained unchanged for African American and Male students and decreased for Foster Youth and Veteran students (*Table 3*).
- 3. An equity gap in transfer-level English throughput emerged for White students in Fall 2020 (*Table 3*).

#### **Course Success**

 A primary explanation for the decline in transfer-level throughput appears to be a notable drop in course success in ENGWR 300 – perhaps attributed to challenges in the remote environment in Fall 2020¹:

- a. Course success for new-to-college students in ENGWR 300 (without the co-requisite) declined from 71.6% to 63.6% in Fall 2020 (*Table 4*).
- b. Course success in ENGWR 300/108 declined from 60.6% to 51.1% in Fall 2020 (Table 5).
- 2. In ENGWR 300 (without the co-requisite), equity gaps increased for Latinx and First Generation students. The equity gap for African American students remained unchanged, and the equity gap for Foster Youth students declined (*Table 4*).
- 3. Notably, in ENGWR 300/108, African American student success declined by more than half from 55.2% to 25.7% in Fall 2020 (*Table 5*).
- 4. Course success in ENGWR 110 for new-to-college students increased from 35.7% to 63.2% in Fall 2020 (*Table 6*).

#### **Conclusions and Recommendations**

First term English throughput can be thought of as the product of three high level factors – placement, enrollment, and success after enrollment. Improvement in any one area could result in improvements in throughput. Although enrollment in transfer-level English increased in Fall 2020, declines in course success resulted in an overall decline in throughput. In terms of equity, Foster Youth students exhibited improvements in throughput in Fall 2020 – driven by improvement in enrollment and a smaller equity gap in course success. On the other hand, course success for African American students declined notably in ENGWR 108/300. With these findings in mind, the Office of Research and Equity makes the following recommendations:

- 1. Critically evaluate potential barriers for African American students in ENGWR 108/300 in the remote environment especially if sections of this course will be offered online in the future.
- 2. Continue to implement and investigate best practices for instruction in transfer-level English.
- 3. In conjunction with exploring effective instructional practices, investigate the gap between placement and enrollment rates in transfer-level English.



# **Data Tables**

## Table 1. Transfer-Level Placement Rates (New Students)

The table below presents transfer-level placement rates for new-to-college students over the last five fall terms. Total cohort sizes are presented in parentheses next to each placement rate. For example, in fall 2018, there were 274 new-to-college African American students. A total of 46% of these students placed into transfer level. Additionally, equity gaps are presented below each rate. An *equity gap* is calculated by subtracting the overall rate from the rate for a particular group. For example, in fall 2019, API students placed 1.9% below the overall rate for their cohort of new-to-college students.

Only valid placements are counted for each term, e.g., placements that are less than two years old at the start of the fall term. In fall 2018, students who placed one level below could have enrolled in ENGWR 108/300 or ENGWR 101. These students were counted as "below transfer-level" - because many enrolled in ENGWR 101. Note that students who did not assess and/or provide GPA information are also counted as below-transfer. Without a placement, these students would technically only be able to enroll in the bottom level of English.

Additionally, equity gaps are presented below each rate. An *equity gap* is calculated by subtracting the overall rate from the rate for a particular group. For example, API students were 4.4% above the overall cohort rate of 47.1% in Fall 2020.
