Inventory of Services	this category.  - ~31% of these students are African American or Hispanic/Latino  Students who have earned 50 or more units who are not close to completing their program.  Students whose GPA is between 2.0-2.3.  - Currently, there are ~1200 students in this category.  - 45% are African American or Hispanic.  Students on Academic Probation.  - Currently, we have ~1400 students in this category  - ~16% are African Amerian or Hispanic.
